BHNA 2006-2007 ACTIVITIES

As usual, BHNA has been active this year. Monitoring redevelopment and subdivision of property in our neighborhood was a major focus at the beginning of the year. Efforts related to that issue resulted in the passage of an ordinance to restrict future subdividing of existing lots in the neighborhoods. This ordinance was also supported by the Council of Neighborhood Associations (CONA).

Interest in developing a BHNA website was another activity that kept several board members busy early in the year. The BHNA website, mybettonhills.org, is now available for all to enjoy with an event calendar, photos of our events, and contact information.

COMING: BHNA DISASTER ASSISTANCE SURVEY

As part of neighborhood disaster planning, we have discussed creating a survey to identify homeowners who wish for someone to check on them in a disaster or emergency. No confidential information would be gathered. During the bad storm that hit Armistead Rd. a few months ago, the Red Cross arrived to provide assistance. If we already had a list of households that requested a check to make sure everything was OK, then we could have handed this off to them. Their trained staff or designated neighborhood members would do the checks. The survey could be expanded to track multiple items like a homeowner's "in case of emergency" information. We have talked about forming a committee to see what other uses the survey could serve for disaster purposes. A rough draft neighborhood disaster kit has also been started to help everyone get prepared not only for hurricanes but for any disaster.

Our Education Committee is encouraged by the continued support of our neighbors with dollars as well as volunteer time to our three neighborhood schools.

During the past fiscal year, your contributions amounted to \$975 for our schools through the Jack Robertson Partners for Excellence Fund! The money was divided between our three neighborhood public schools: Kate Sullivan Elementary, Cobb Middle, and Leon High.

Leon High used the money for new band instruments and a small contribution was made to Project Graduation.

We directed the funds at Cobb Middle School to the Elizabeth Cobb Scholarship Fund. This fund enables band students who can't afford an instrument to rent one – a great opportunity for the school and developing musicians. Holly Kennedy, band director, was absolutely thrilled as the music programs rarely get contributions. Kate Sullivan purchased books for the new media center in our name.

**CAROL BELLAMY TRUST FUND/
GOAL: NEIGHBORHOOD BEAUTIFICATION**

Your donations to the Carol Bellamy Fund enable volunteers to plant trees and shrubs in our neighborhood parks and islands and to provide benches in parks. On Arbor Day 2007, a group of neighbors planted live oaks, red cedars and a pond cypress on the banks of a holding pond along the new Betton Hill Nature Trail. This trail will eventually run between McCord and Winthrop Parks. We also mulched the plantings that have been planted in the park during previous Arbor Days with pine straw provided by the City of Tallahassee. We added blueberry bushes, cherry laurels and an American beech tree to plantings along Trescott.

Our largest project for the day, however, was the construction of a large compost bin on the Armistead side of Winthrop Park. Neighbors contribute leaves and small trimmings and the resulting compost is free to

anyone who wants to remove it from the bottom of the pile. Help yourself!

The Bellamy Fund also supports the planting and maintenance of islands and traffic calming devices in the neighborhood. These islands could be eyesores, but due to the work of several neighbors, they are pleasant and beautiful neighborhood accents.

We thank **Philip Froemke** for the many years that he has planted and maintained the Betton Road island. Philip has moved from the neighborhood so someone needs to step forward to continue maintenance there; it is heavily planted so just needs periodic weeding.

The Trescott island was planted by **Mari-Jo and Ken Lewis-Wilkinson** and they will continue to maintain the island, but could use some help. **Mary Kay Falconer** weeded and mulched the island in August. Let Mari-Jo know if you can help (385-6774).

We also thank the Fink Family (**Andy, Beth, Cameron and Ashley**) for their continued maintenance of the lirioppe beds on the traffic calming devices on Woodgate Way. They look great! I am not sure who is maintaining the islands on Lee Avenue, but they always look nice too.

We funded two sturdy benches in Chittenden Park, also, and the supplies needed to clean our lovely Betton Hills markers.

This year we plan to continue to remove Chinese tallow trees and mimosa trees from McCord Park. This is a slow process, but one that must be dealt with regularly. We will also plan another Arbor Day event and hope to see you there. It is always a good time, working with friends and neighbors.

The Bill and Marge Mansfield Writer’s Fund supports Leon students like Jessica as they move on to college. We had two winners this past year, Jessica and Jenny Lieb. The Leon journalism teacher selects the award winner based on the student’s diligent efforts in journalism, serving as a key worker for either the student newspaper or student yearbook (the yearbook at Leon includes stories as well as pictures), and being one who may not receive other scholarships for college work. The winners each received a \$350 scholarship from BHNA.

The fund honors the memory of longtime Betton Hills residents Bill and Marge Mansfield. Bill was a working journalist for much of his life and was committed to helping new journalists find their “voice.”

Bill came to Tallahassee in 1965, serving as Bureau Chief for the Miami Herald.

He worked as the Editorial Page Editor for the Democrat in the 1980’s and 90’s. Bill wrote and spoke publicly on education, the environment, integration, and many other issues of local interest.

After his retirement in 1995, and until his death in 2000, Bill devoted his time and talents to volunteering his services to a number of worthy causes, one of which was the BHNA. Bill was our newsletter editor and a respected voice on our Board of Directors.

Bill would be the first to say that Marge contributed a great deal to his success. She was a fine thinker, didn’t hesitate to voice her opinions, and had a great desire to see each person in our society treated fairly. As a BHNA board member, she was particularly active in our events organized to get neighbors to know one another better. Marge died in 2005.
